About your Property Taxes

Assessment Notices

Property Assessment Notices were sent out by MPAC (Municipal Property Assessment Corporation) for all Residential only properties the week of April 18th, 2016. All other property classes (including properties with residential as well as other classes) are to be sent out the weeks of October 11, 18 & 24, 2016. If you do not receive your notice, or you have questions in regards to your notice, please contact MPAC at 1-866-296-6722.

Pre-authorized Payment of Property Taxes

Consider paying your property taxes by pre-authorized payment. There are no administration fees and your payment will never be late. There are 2 options; 10 monthly payments from January to October, withdrawn on the 15th of each month or 4 installment payments withdrawn on the tax due dates. Authorization forms are available online or at the Township office.

Final Tax Installment due October 31, 2016

2017 Taxes are due on the last business day of February, May, August and October

You can use this system to report:

- Driving Complaints
- Theft & Damage to Property / Vehicle Under \$5000

If you prefer, you may still contact the OPP by phone to report a crime to have an officer attend. **Do not use this system if it is an emergency!**

From the Public Works Department

Snow Removal: Residents are reminded that it's an offense to deposit snow or ice on a roadway. Snow pushed or blown onto a road creates a hazard to both vehicles and snow removal equipment and can interfere with water flow in ditches. This practice contravenes Township of Blandford-Blenheim By-law Number 455-82 and similarly The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, C.H.8, S 181, which states "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry or Road Authority responsible for the maintenance of the road".

To assist with snow removal operations, parking is restricted on all Township maintained streets in the urban centres of Bright, Drumbo, Plattsville and Princeton during the winter season. Parking is restricted on these streets from 8:00.A.M to 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday from November 1st to March 31st. Parking on main streets maintained by the County of Oxford is restricted from 2:00 A.M. to 6:00 A.M. during the same period.

Did you know? As per Provincial Law, the Highway Act prohibits parking that interferes with snow clearing and allows removal of any vehicle blocking plows at the owners expense.

Mailboxes: The Township of Blandford Blenheim will replace broken mailboxes only if snow removal equipment makes physical contact with the mailbox. Landowners are responsible to ensure mailboxes are securely attached to their post.

HOME ESCAPE PLANNING

It is **vital** that you know what to do when the smoke alarms sound in an emergency: Sit down with everyone in your home and discuss how each person will get out in a fire.

GET OUT & STAY OUT!

When the smoke alarms sound, get out immediately and call 9-1-1 from outside. Never re-enter a burning building. **You need to be outside when the firefighters arrive.**



CHANGE YOUR CLOCKS, CHANGE YOUR BATTERIES!

On November 6, 2016, continue the simple, life-saving habit of changing and testing the batteries in smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors when setting the clocks back for daylight-saving time.
